GIFTS AND GRANTS

The <u>National Science Foundation</u> has awarded the following grants to Prairie View A&M.

- \$40,151 for support of the 1971 NSF Summer Institute for Secondary School Teachers. The Institute will be under the direction of Dr. E. E. O'Banion, Department of Chemistry.
- 2. <u>\$11,305</u> for administration of Institutional Grants for Science. This is an additional grant for this purpose, bringing the total to \$21,620.
 - 3. <u>\$21,320</u> for support of the 1971 Summer Institute in Mathematics for Secondary Teachers. The grant is under the direction of Dr. A. D. Stewart, Department of Mathematics.

Mobil Oil Corporation has awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to the College to be used for a student who served in Mobil's Summer Engineering Experience Program.

AGRICULTURAL BUILDING

The Texas A&M Board of Directors recently approved plans for construction of a greenhouse complex and farm shop building, along with the purchase of necessary farm equipment. Contracts are to be negotiated beginning in February, 1971.
