Gore, Bush teeter-totter 2000 election



Texas Governor George Bush and Vice-President Al Gore competed in one of the tighest Presidential Elections in history.

As most Americans went to sleep Tuesday night, presidential hopefuls Texas Governor George Bush and Vice-President Al Gore still waited for a decision to be made.

Neither of the candidates secured the needed 270 of the 538 electoral college votes.

Gore earned 260 votes from states including California, Minnesota, New York, Illinois and the District of Columbia.

While Bush hauled in Texas, Louisiana, Alabama, Georgia and, surprisingly Gore's home, Tennessee.

Florida, which has 25 electoral votes at stake, will be the deciding factor.

Early in the evening numbers reflected that Gore would take Florida, Michigan and Pennsylvania leading him to a possible win

As the evening matured, most networks recalled Florida, claiming that the race was too close to call.

In another late twist, most major networks declared Bush the 43rd President without the official tally from Florida.

This was then recalled and the election remained undecided.

A final decision could not be made until all the votes in the state of Florida are recounted.

In Houston, voters elected to support a Houstonbid to host the 2012 Olympics.

This decision allows state comptrollers to use various forms of taxes.

Taxes from Olympic visitor's hotel visits, food purchases and various other incentives will be placed in an account. If Houston is chosen to host the Olympics and

money is lost then this account will be activated.


Houston is among nine other U.S. cities attempting to become a candidate. The U.S. Olympic Committee will make its selection in late 2002 and The International Olympic Committee will choose the host city in 2005.

Houston is the only city with three-domed stadiums.

These stadiums will now be accompanied by a new downtown sports arena. This voter-decision reverses the decision that was made a year ago.

The stadium will be the home of the Houston Rockets and Houston Comets after their 30-year lease with the Compaq Center expires in 2003.

PV student attempts to set world-records

Prairie View A&M University is known for producing productive people and Chadrick Adams is definitely one of them.

Adams will attempt to make history in December at the Guinness Book of World Records studios by playing the tuba for 24 hours.

After playing in the

Marching Storm for five years, Adams feels that he is one of the best, if not the best, tuba player. He felt this proven because of his many victories and praises from fellow band members and directors.

"My sound is totally different. It's full volume," Adams exclaimed proudly.

After his graduation in July 2000, he realized he had not yet made a mark in

the history of PV.

"I thought if I get in the Guinness Book of World Records, students would be sure to remember me," said Adams.

He immediately started his quest with officials of Guinness World Records through a letter for which he did not receive a response. He then searched the Internet and was able to make contact. After submitting a five-hour tape

of playing the tuba, officials knew he was serious. He had the same 'punch' in the fifth hour that he had in the first hour.

Officials told Adams they wanted him to attempt his feat in the December show at their California studios.

Adams is trying to get the show to tape here in Prairie View. It is scheduled to air in Spring 2001. Officials will watch Adams play for 24 hours, only permitting him to stop for one or two minutes to get a sip of water, turn music pages, change tubas, or use the bathroom.

During the performance he will have two tubas and three mouthpieces. Music played during the duration will cover rap, and rhythm and blues melodies.
